State of Maryland Allegany County, et

On this fifteenth day of October in the year eighteen hundred and forty one personally appeared before the Orphans Court of the County and state aforesaid Sarah McKenzie a resident of the neighborhood of Leesport in said County aged seventy two years, who being first duly sworn according to law doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed July 4 1838 entitled "An act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows" That she is the widow of James McKenzie who was a private in the capacity of a drummer in the Maryland line in the army of the Revolution and who in his life time was a pensioner of the United States.

She further declares that she was married to the said James McKenzie on the day of December in the year seventeen hundred and eighty four and that her husband the said James McKenzie died on the third day of March in the year eighteen hundred and twenty four, that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service but the marriage took place previous to the first day of January seventeen hundred and ninety four at the time above stated.

On this *ten th* day of *October* 1820, personally appeared in open court,
being a court of record for the said county, *Alfred M. Hinson* aged *Sixty three*
years, resident in said county, who, being first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on
his oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows:—

that he was enlisted
in the year 1776 in Captain Parsons Company Col.
Mathias Regiment, that he was in the Battle of
Red Bank and Monmouth and served until
the end of the war, that he made application
originally on the 22nd Day of April 1818 and
received a Pension Certificate number Eight-
Thousand nine hundred and fifteen

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States, on the 18th day of March, 1818; and
that I have not, since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with
intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to
provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary war,"
passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property, or se-
curities, contracts, or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto
annexed, and by me subscribed.

On the twenty second day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen before me the subscriber one of the associate judges of the fifth judicial circuit of Maryland, which circuit is composed of the Counties of Allegany Washington & Frederick personally appeared Morris McKensy aged fifty eight years resident in Allegany County aforesaid who being duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land & Naval Service of the United States in the revolutionary war" that he is the same Morris McKensy who enlisted in Frederick Town in the State of Maryland in the Company commanded by Capt. Ballgale of the German Regt a part of the Prussian Land Arm that he continued to serve in the said corps in the service of the United States for three years and then enlisted for the war against the expedition of which he was discharged in Annapolis in the State of Maryland that he was in the battle of Monmouth, and siege of York, and that he is in need of circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support, and that he has no other witness now in his power, of his said service.

I Thomas Buchanan one of the associate judges of the fifth judicial circuit aforesaid, do certify that it appears to my satisfaction that the said Morris McKensy did serve in the revolutionary war as stated in the preceding declaration against the common Enemy, and I now transmit the proceedings & testimony taken and read before me to the Secretary of the Department of War, pursuant to the provisions of the aforementioned act of Congress.

Sir:

Moses McKenzie was a drummer in the American Army for some seven or eight years during the war of the Revolution. He received a pension during the latter part of his life. He is dead, and since his death, his widow also drew a pension until the time of her death. The papers in his case for a pension, contain the evidence of his services.

It is alleged by his children (living near this place) that when the army was disbanded at the close of the revolution, the government owed him about £200. of back pay. Are the children of Moses McKenzie under the acts of congress entitled to any thing for their father's services, and if so, to what are they so entitled? I think the old man also received some land from the government, but of that I am not certain.
